#### **BRAINSTORMING BOLDLY AGREEMENT**

**Today I will do my best** to show up as my most energetic, engaged self.

#### TRAITS OF A GOOD BRAINSTORM

- Active, intentional listening to understand the presenter's vision
- 2. Asking thoughtful questions to dig into it
- 3. Imagining alongside the Ideator
- 4. To practice suspending reality. Nothing is impossible (for now)
- 5. Exploring the five senses
- Setting your ego aside and remembering the end goal
- 7. Poking holes politely
- 8. Ramping up the boldness
- 9. Making a safe space for practicing
- 10. Reframing when necessary

#### THE REFRAME RULE

To support a constructive conversation the yellow reframe card can be used if someone is talking too long or too often or if comments are negative or sap the energy in the group.

Avoid the Yellow Card! Be brief in your comments, be open minded and help lift the conversation and make sure everyone gets a chance to talk.
